



The direct project users are the heads of local farmers' coordinating bodies and the regional committee CRCR, and a few individual producers. These are the individuals who will use the ICT services in the offices of the Local Committees and the CRCR, and who will pass the information on to local unions of farmers' organisations, or from the local unions to CRCR and beyond. This capacity-building effort should benefit farmers. Through a more structured communication system, the farmers will be more informed about policy issues and production and market opportunities.

### Goals

The main goal is to put farmers in contact with one another and engage CRCR members in the agricultural policy debate. More specific goals include:

- *Improving the information system* - Improve the information system linking producers.
- *Internet access* - Give farmers direct access to information through the internet.
- *Strengthen cooperation* - Strengthen cooperation and trust among farmers.
- *Information flow* - Facilitate the flow of information between the regional committee and the local coordinating committees of farmers' organisations, and among these organisations themselves. Additional goals include organising annual debates for farmers, facilitating cooperation between support structures and farmers, and enabling male and female farmers to provide and receive information that is useful for their activities.

### Results so far

The visibility of the regional committee to other related institutions and organisations has increased considerably. This has resulted in a number of new partnerships and funding opportunities.

One important lesson learned is that farmers feel less of a barrier with a structure such as that of the regional committee centres than they do with traditional cybercafés or telecentres. Moreover, the computer centres make it possible for farmers to get together on a regular basis, to get information on important issues and to develop more structural organisational ties, both internally and with external partners

In some cases, based on the feedback gathered through the information system, CRCR has been able to quickly respond to the new legislation proposals for agricultural legislation and to influence the process and propose textual changes. In addition, the efficiency and speed of the farmers consultation process in the Sikasso province has dramatically improved. While in the past, it could take months before information would reach farmers, now most farmer representatives can be reached within hours or at the most a few days.

Finally, one point of concern is that, at the operational level, the lack of any appropriate connectivity and energy infrastructure is still a major obstacle to successful implementation. This implies that, for the time being, much attention should be given to technical issues relating to the project.
